

CORDERO AND HERNANDEZ EXECUTE PERFECT STRATEGY AFTER DAY 4 AT LA CARRERA PANAMERICANA Day 4 Morelia - Guanajuato

GUANAJUATO, OCTOBER 19.- La Carrera Panamericana reached one of the favorite places for national and international motorsports: the State of Guanajuato, where the pilots received a warm welcome from fans who, from a distance in the streets surrounding the Juarez Theater, met to greet their idols and even passed on a well-deserved cold drink.

After mechanical difficulties from Sunday's run, the pilots managed to drive the 69.79 kilometers, spread over six speed stages, with greater regularity and fewer mechanical incidents.

The fight for first place continues to focus on the three crews of the Turismo Mayor category. After the victory achieved on Day 3 by the couple of "El Commander", Hilaire and Laura Damiron facing the stretches in Morelia, on Monday Ricardo Cordero and the Marco Hernández returned to the fight on the offensive with much more determination on this fourth day of competition.

"El Malditillo," won two of the first speed stages in the morning, ceding only one to the French-Brazilian team. After the service break, on the way to Guanajuato, it was the defending champion who scored an important time difference to maintain the strategy that brings them a closer to the three-time championship of La Carrera Panamericana.

"We have accumulated over the days a significant advantage in the overall time, out there of about a 40-minute, that is why yesterday with the rainy conditions, we decided to manage and not risk the car in the last stages of the day. It's something Hilaire took advantage of that's been working very well for us. Today, we decided to give it our all at Mil Cumbres and got more than 30 seconds of head start in the morning. The car is in perfect condition, the strategy is different for each day because there is still half the route ahead, today we will be happy to reach with an advantage to Guanajuato," said Cordero, who turns today's day, as the third won, so far, in the 33rd edition of this competition.

La Carrera Panamericana has already gone over 1,620 kilometers, and this Tuesday its participants will face again the roads in Guanajuato, then on their way through Aguascalientes going through La Congoja, to face La Bufa in Zacatecas, the finish line of Day 5.
